

# Using ConfiForms ListView with Confluence Table of Contents macro

In this quick demo we will show how to use ConfiForms ListView macro with Confluence Table of Contents macro

We have a simple form in ConfiForms - with just 2 fields, one to hold the value for "header", and it is called "h" and another field called "ta" to hold some text

ConfiForms Form Definition | formName = myform

ConfiForms (Form View) Registrations Control

ConfiForms Form Field Definition | fieldName = h | fieldLabel ...

ConfiForms Form Field Definition | fieldName = ta | fieldLabel...

What we want to render is something as follows

## classic lorem

On the other hand, we denounce with righteous indignation and dislike men who are so beguiled and demoralized by the charms of pleasure of the moment, so blinded by desire, that they cannot foresee the pain and trouble that are bound to ensue; and equal blame belongs to those who fail in their duty through weakness of will, which is the same as saying through shrinking from toil and pain. These cases are perfectly simple and easy to distinguish. The problem is that if we use the original formatting from the edit for ConfiForms fields we will not get correct IDs for the header values and that stops the Table of Contents macro from working correctly

What we need to do is the following trick

## Table of Contents

CONF: ConfiForms ListView | formName = myform | pageTitle = ConfiForms with Table of Contents

### HTML

CONF: ConfiForms Form Field | fieldName = ta

We generate the H1 headers with the help of HTML macro and generate IDs ourselves (replacing the spaces from the values as well as non-latin letters and symbols if any)

This makes Table of Contents macro happy and it starts to work well with the contents generated by ConfiForms
